Textiles included are hand-woven and natural-dyed from Ivory Coast artisans and weavers along with pillows made from vintage Kantha quilts from the rural areas of West Bengal in India. Antique linen with floral embroidery, hand-printed floral motifs, damask weave, wool crewel embroidery and linen toile are all part of this worldly mix. The pillows are both refined and rustic with the addition of Turkish hand-woven Hamam towels in undyed natural linen with embroidery.

Along with the vintage textiles, the company will once again show the soulful clay sculptures of the beloved Thai artist, Arjan Deng. Classic reproductions of porcelains from the Northern and Southern Song Dynasty and carved jade on stands from the Tang Dynasty will be for sell.
