The new terracotta dog collection was conceived by the company's president, Brownlee Currey, who is an avid dog lover. All four dogs are hand-made of terracotta clay by Thai artist, Nhut Nhathawut, and are of a substantial size ranging from 16 inches to 24 inches in height. The humorous face of each dog is unique. A favorite dog shown below is “Rocky” the Teckel who is known for only biting below the knee and was last seen wading in the ocean just off Miami.

China is the birthplace of porcelain and has been responsible for transforming how people made functional and decorative objects for more than 1,000 years. Young, emerging artist, Yang Xiang Hong has created an accessory collection that is a menagerie of fish, fowl, and other animals to debut at the Fall 2023 High Point Market. The artistic designs are hand-made of a fine-quality porcelain with hand-painted accents for each of the characters. No two are exactly the same. These Picasso inspired pieces will add a distinctive flair to any room with a touch of humor.

The Turtle Set includes three sculptures made of reclaimed wood that make them look like antiques. The primitive feel of the pieced-together reptiles increases the sense of whimsy their composition reflects. The two babies hitching a ride with the parent tell a lively story that will make the composition the highlight of any vignette. Because the rustic pieces are made from recycled wood, each set will be unique.

Each market the company displays one-of-a-kind and vintage artifacts that are only available in the showroom and not on their website or in the catalog. These special pieces are a treat for market attendees, and provide original handicrafts and art objects that can only be found by traveling to the far corners of the world. The objects are perfect for interior designers who want to add the final touch to an interior, and add depth and texture to a room. The new, vibrant Clayday Raku Collection will debut at High Point Market and is sure to bring a

smile to the faces of attendees. Each raku sculpture is hand-built by Thai artist, Nupol Wiriyawong. His clay objects are placed in a small red-hot kiln, removed while still glowing from the heat, and allowed to cool outside of the kiln. The results of this method are unpredictable, as it creates a multitude of effects that include crackled surfaces and beautiful metallics, which enhance the natural imperfections in this low-fire pottery. Because the clay can be fired in a small kiln, it is a sustainable way to create ceramic art.
